Principal's Message

Inquisitive Minds Workshops

This week Kadina High School hosted Inquisitive Minds. Inquisitive minds is a Sydney based company which specialises in hands on Mathematics programs to stimulate and enrich student's mathematical experiences. Throughout the 2 days of workshops junior Kadina High School students and local primary school students from Lismore Heights, Goonellabah and Clunes participated in a range of logical thinking and problem-solving activities.

Year 6 Orientation

Students entering Year 7 at Kadina High School in 2014 spent a two day orientation at the school this week. The students were able to experience what life is like at high school and were given an opportunity to study subjects not normally offered in primary school. Parents and teachers also met up with a BBQ being held on the Thursday afternoon.

All money raised through the sales of school uniforms is used by the P&C to fund school initiatives. For example in 2013 through monies raised the school was able to purchase a new overlocker for TAS, AFL jerseys, Rugby League jerseys, a 24 channel sound mixing desk and speakers for CAPA, Technology for Visual Arts, and the Launch class, 80 electronic kits for Science, and 2014 School Captain blazers. The P&C also supported students financially for state sport representation and leadership programs. Other support programs include AIME, and the Chrysalis program. With funds raised through the sales of uniform the school canteen is also able to keep food costs to a minimum.

Financial assistance is available for those experiencing financial difficulties. Application forms are available by contacting the school office.

A reminder the school canteen does not have EFTPOS facilities and takes cash and cheques (payable to - Kadina High School Canteen) only.

IMPROVING LITERACY AND NUMERACY NATIONAL PARTNERSHIP (ILNNP)

Earlier this year Kadina High School received a considerable funding grant tied to improving Literacy and Numeracy. As a school we were required to decide upon a focus for this funding in either Literacy or Numeracy. It was decided to place our main focus on Numeracy in stage 4.

Mrs Lee Boyd was appointed to coordinate this program. Mrs Boyd has spent a considerable amount of time and effort collecting and analysing Numeracy data from a variety of sources. As a result Mrs Boyd has identified areas to focus upon in developing Numeracy skills in our students. Mrs Boyd has also been identifying, evaluating and purchasing relevant Numeracy resources across the curriculum to enrich our student's learning experiences.

Intensive Numeracy Workshops

Recently Mrs Boyd and Mr Peter Fletcher, (a retired teacher who many of you would know,) have been conducting intensive numeracy workshops for our Year 7 and 8 students. Mrs Boyd prepared these workshops to respond to the needs of our students she identified in her analysis of data. In these workshops the students have worked on developing numeracy skills in place value, patterns and number structure, and basic operations. All students will receive the benefit of these workshops.

MANSW Numeracy

This month (27th and 28th November) we were visited by Debbie Smith from "Inquisitive Minds" who delivered further workshops based on problem solving. All students from Years 7 & 8 had the opportunity to participate in these workshops along with some Year 5 and 6 students from Goonellabah, Lismore Heights and Clunes Primary Schools. Mathematics teachers and teachers from our local Primary School benefited from the professional experience of assisting with the presentation of these workshops.

Teacher Professional Development

Mrs Boyd is also organising to provide staff from across all Key Learning Area's the opportunity to examine their Syllabi and Programs to develop a greater understanding of the way the Numeracy Continuum is relevant to their subject and how the inclusion of Numeracy outcomes can be achieved.


