## The Rivers Secondary College/Rivers P-12 Learning Community.

The Rivers Secondary College is progressing with a variety of activities to date. The Rivers Secondary College is made up of the three secondary campuses in Lismore - Kadina High, Lismore High and Richmond River High, which is an integral member of the larger Rivers P-12 Learning Community across the Lismore and surrounding area. Our focus across the whole Rivers P-12 Learning Community is to develop increased collaboration with improved student outcomes as our driving agenda. The Rivers P-12 is composed of the three Secondary College campuses, Nimbin Central School, Wilson Park School for Specific Purposes, and twenty six primary schools in and around Lismore.

The Rivers Secondary College Year 11 Curriculum patterns are now published and available in each of the secondary campuses. This collaboration means that the vast majority of students gain access to their first choices of subjects being studied for the HSC. These travel arrangements are ONLY for stage 6, Years 11 and 12 and NOT for Years 7-10. Years 7-10 students will continue to attend their own school for all of their classes as has been the case up until now. We continue to look at opportunities to increase our collaborations, but students in Year 7-10 are not being transported to access their regular curriculum options. Indeed, there is no current thinking around a senior secondary high campus for ONLY Years 11 and 12 either. The commitment and focus of The Rivers Secondary College is for three individual campuses each continuing to offer high quality comprehensive secondary provision 7-12. Initial planning is soon to commence to develop a Rivers P-12 Learning Community School Musical production for 2015. There is a lot of enthusiasm for this activity across both the primary and secondary schools which will showcase our students and staff talents and further develop inter-school cohesion.

Working parties in the areas of Student Wellbeing, Transition, Curriculum and Professional Learning are being formed currently as is the final membership of The Rivers Council, a broad based community advisory group. I am more than happy to attend and speak to interested parents and citizens (P&C) groups, interested organisations and to listen to any ideas that are in line with our endeavours to improve our impact on our students learning achievements. # **GRAFFITI VANDALISM**

# A graffiti offence is defined as an offence under the Graffiti Act, including:

- · damaging or defacing property by means of a graffiti implement
- · possession of a graffiti implement
- affixing bill posters or marking premises by chalk
- sale or supply of paint cans to, or possession of spray cans by, persons under 18 years of age

Warning, cautions and conferences no longer available for Police to consider with Young Offenders for graffiti offences

# Instead, put your talent to good use, buy a blank canvas from your local discount store and create artworks that will last!

A person who maliciously damages property belonging to another: Penalty: Maximum of 5 years jail

Damaging and defacing property by means of any graffiti implement, or in such a manner that the mark is not readily removable by wiping or by the use of water or detergent.

# Penalty: Maximum of 12 months jail, \$2,200 fine or community service order.

A person must not have spray paint in the persons possession with the intention that it should be used to damage or deface premises or other property.

# Penalty: Maximum of 3 months jail , \$1,100 fine or community service order.

## SCHOOL DEVELOPED BOARD ENDORSED COURSE

Agriculture- Equine Studies is a 2 unit course approved by the NSW Board of Studies. The Equine Studies course is completed over two years and involves 240 hours of study (120 Preliminary and 120 HSC).

Evans River K-12 Community School offers this course to students from all schools in the district as well as mature age students.

It offers basic skills in awareness of safe practices, legal responsibilities, necessary insurances, horse management, equitation, team work and communication. It is the only such course offering these skills and has particular value in that it is mapped to the National Coach Accreditation Scheme (NACS), Level 1 Coach (equestrian) and the Sport and Recreation (Coach) Equestrian Training package.

Many of the students who have completed the course over the past ten years have given feedback that the skills and confidence they have developed as a result of Equine Studies have been invaluable in other areas of interest.
