Japan Trip

During the school holidays three Kadina High Students Brandon Yee, Aleesa Cuthbert, Roan Beuker, one Lismore High student Reagan Friederich and Woodlawn student Amelia Hughes were accompanied by council worker Michella Wade on the Lismore to Yamato Takada Student Exchange program. The students arrived at the Gold Coast Airport at 4 am and caught a plane to Cairns International Airport where they then caught another plane to Kansai airport in Osaka. The trip took 13 hours. We were met by Kazuyoshi and Mineko and were taken to meet our host families.

During the trip we went to Bamboo English School and taught the kids how to play cricket. We went to the local middle school, met the mayor of Yamato Takada, went to some local pre-schools, went to Kadina High's sister school, Yamato Takada Commercial High School where we participated in English classes, calligraphy classes and a traditional tea ceremony. We went to Nara where we visited Todadji Temple and Asuka village where we visited traditional burial mounds.

On the last day in Yamato Takada we said farewell to our host family. A lot of tears were shed. We then travelled to Hiroshima by Bullet Train and visited the "A-Bomb Museum" which was a very emotional experience for all of us. We hung a string of cranes at the Children's Peace Memorial. We caught a ferry to Miyajima Island and finally went to a cat café before heading to the airport. Unfortunately our flight was delayed by 4 hours.

This was an amazing experience for all of us. We were able to experience such a different and amazing culture and we are all so thankful. It was an unforgettable experience and we are already planning a reunion.

Work Readiness Achievment Program (WRAP)

During term 4 our Year 11 WRAP students have been participating in a Community Immersion Program where they have been given the opportunity to immerse themselves in a variety of community groups and events.

On the 28th October they went to the Lismore Soup Kitchen where the students volunteered their time to be involved in preparing and serving meals for those in need. Students were also given the opportunity of some invaluable front of house experiences by serving coffees and handling money.



On Friday the 4th November, Bangalow Weir had a planting day so they again volunteered their time and went along to help beautify the area. Overall they assisted in the planting of over 250 shrubs and can't wait to go back at a later date to see how their plants have grown.

After they finished their planting they went to Lismore SES where they learnt all about the roles and responsibilities of an SES volunteer. They also had fun practicing with some of the professional equipment used to rescue people.



On the 11th November they visited Sugarshine Farm Sanctuary at Wyrallah, where abandoned and rescued farm animals are loved and cared for. They got to feed and nurture lots of the animals including piglets, pigs, goats and a baby calf.

Last week, the 18th November, they went for a visit to Lismore Police Station where they were given a rundown of the various areas of the police force, from the dog squad to highway patrol, and the important role each plays in society. They were given an extensive tour of the station, including the lockup area, mug shot photo booth and finger printing station. Senior Constable Straun Presgrove is the Youth Liaison Officer and he explained all the different roles that are carried out by all the various people in the police station. After their visit to the police station they went into Lismore Courthouse House where they sat in on some cases in the Local Court then went into the District Court where the judge was summing up a case to the jury.

They finished the day with a visit to the Legal Aid office where a solicitor explained her role and the role of Legal Aid in general. Students were also asked some general legal questions about right and wrong which they all answered correctly.



Each week as a follow up students have written recounts about their experiences, researched further the roles of volunteers in society and graphed out on maps the areas we have visited.
