Kadina High campus was blessed to have the opportunity to receive Ricky Cook who delivered a welcome to country in Language. In place of the traditional Australian anthem for this years NAIDOC assembly, we instead had a different version read to us. This anthem was written by Judith Durham in collaboration with Aboriginal elders and speaks about the Dreaming and the importance of living in harmony. In addition to Mr Cook, we also had the pleasure of Mr Billy Smith, and one of our own students Latysha Smith-Bruce, performing a number of songs entertaining the crowd. Further entertainment was provided by the Rivers College Indigenous dance group at the end of the assembly, further enhancing the importance of these vibrant cultures and the promotion of heritage and identity, especially through Language. The importance of language was further highlighted by the address of our Principal, Mr Ian Davies, who highlighted the influence of colonisation on his own heritage and the change that occurred through loss of language.

Before the assembly some of the current year 11 & 12 Aboriginal students planted the first trees in what will become the NAIDOC Native Bush Tucker garden. It now features Native Ginger and Finger Limes.

Year 8 Endeavour STEM Project

During terms 1 and 2, the Year 8 Endeavour STEM class was given the task to design and build a crane. The design brief asked that the crane had to lift a designated weight from the horizontal to a designated height, while sitting on a bed of jelly. The jelly was load tested and the crane had to have feet that were big enough not to fall through the jelly. Students needed to calculate the required dimensions of the crane boom arm, as well as the required counter weights to prevent the crane from toppling. All groups produced a successful solution and students learnt a lot from the exercise.

2017 Science and Engineering Challenge at Southern Cross University

The University of Newcastle presents the Science and Engineering Challenge in conjunction with Southern Cross University. It is a day-long competition designed to provide year 10 (or year 9) high school students with a positive experience of science and engineering. It also encourages students to consider a career in Science or Engineering, and to study the enabling sciences in senior high school. On Friday 23rd June, Mrs O'Sullivan and 30 students from years 9 and 10 headed to Southern Cross University for the annual Science and Engineering Challenge. Students are put into groups of two to four and each group has a challenge (or two) that they must complete during the day. Points were awarded on teamwork; creativity and successful completion of tasks. Two of the groups came first in their challenges. Declan Flowers, Brad Wotherspoon and Riley Couch had success with the Confounding communications activity while Lilli Hjelmstrom, Kaitlyn-Lee Currie, Elijah Askew-Smith and Lucien McMahon excelled at the ElectraCITY task. All participants had a great day and were positive ambassadors for Kadina with their behaviour and spirit. Many of the year 9 students are looking forward to going again next year.

Nyholm Youth Lecture "Mother Nature's Molecules - the good, the bad and the ugly" by Dr Alice Williamson

Students in 10S1 and 9S1 were lucky enough to be presented with a Nyholm Youth Lecture in conjunction with speakers from Southern Cross University. The Nyholm Lecture Series commemorates Sir Ronald Nyholm FRS (1917-1971), an outstanding Australian researcher and passionate chemical educator. Dr Alice Williamson presented a very interesting and interactive lecture that focused on the difference between natural and unnatural substances. She dispelled the belief that all synthetic or unnatural substances are bad for us and that some natural substances can be quite harmful. Dr Williamson clearly conveyed her enthusiasm for Chemistry and the students developed their understanding in this area. Dr Lachlan Lee from Southern Cross University also spoke to the students about doing a job you love and are passionate about. Students also received information about the Head Start program that is run through Southern Cross University. This program allows successful Year 11 and 12 applicants to undertake a unit of study at the university while still at school. Year 10 HSIF Excursion

On the 29th of June, 2017, Year 10 HSIE students went on an excursion to Queensland Museum and Queensland Gallery of Modern Art (GOMA). Students attended the 'Gladiators: Heroes of the Colosseum' exhibition whereby students were able to explore and examine various exhibition features of more than 110 original artefacts including pieces of the Colosseum, authentic elaborately decorated bronze gladiator helmets and original arms and armour preserved in the ashes of Pompeii. Some students had the opportunity to dress in traditional Gladiator helmets and shields to experience what it may have been like to participate as one of the heroes of the colosseum.

GOMA presented the Marvel: Creating the Cinematic Universe exhibition which allowed students to be immersed in the world of Marvel. Drawing on Marvel's extensive archive of original comic books, spectacular concept art, props and costumes, as well as private collections, the exhibition features over 500 unique objects including Thor's hammer, Iron Man's suit of armour, Captain America's shield, and never-before-seen set pieces from the highly anticipated Thor: Ragnarok 2017, including the majestic Asgardian throne room.



The Rivers Secondary College, Kadina High Campus will transition to the new NSW Public Schools' finance system and a new bank account on **4 September 2017**. To ensure a smooth transition, there will be changes to the way we accept payments from parents and carers.

- EFTPOS payments: We will not be able to accept EFTPOS payments between 28
 August and 4 September 2017. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding
 EFTPOS payments before close of business Friday 25 August 2017.
 From 5 September 2017, EFTPOS payments will be accepted as before.
- 2. Cash and cheque payments: Between 28 August 2017 and 5 September 2017, we will also not be able to accept payments by cash or cheque as we prepare to close our current bank account and transition to the new one. Please ensure that you have made any outstanding cash or cheque payments before close of business Friday 25 August 2017. From 5 September 2017, cash and cheque payments will be accepted as before.
- 3. Online payments: As of 4 September 2017, we will begin to accept online payments using the Department of Education's Parent Online Payment (POP) system. A button to access this online payment system titled '\$ Make a Payment' will be visible on the utility bar on the front page of our school's website at http://www.kadina-h.schools.nsw.edu.au. By selecting this link, parents and carers will be taken to a secure Westpac QuickWeb payment page, from which they can make online payments.

Please note: As a Westpac-hosted solution, cardholder and account details will be held securely, helping to protect the school and its customers from fraudulent transactions as well as assisting in meeting the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCIDSS) compliance requirements.
