Children's Week Parliament 2018

On Monday 24 October 2018, children and young people took over Parliament House during Children's Week. This year ACYP continued their valued partnership with YMCA to deliver the NSW Children's Week Youth Parliament program, following on from its success in 2017. This Year Lachlan Robertson from Kadina High represented the Lismore Elective.

The one-day program was offered to 93 children and young people in years 7-10 free of charge to ensure that cost was not a barrier for participation. The children and young people came from areas across NSW including Sydney, the Illawarra, Hunter, South East, Riverina Murray, New England, North Coast, West and Far West.

The NSW Advocate, Andrew Johnson and YMCA CEO Susannah Le Bron gave the young people helpful advice and Members of Parliament were invited to speak with children and young people as part of an interview panel on the day. Members of Parliament Taylor Martin MLC, Paul Green MLC, Courtney Houssos MLC, Alex Greenwich MP and Andrew Fraser MP gave advice and spoke about their time as an elected representative and what they are passionate about. The Legislative Assembly Chamber was presided over by MPs Greg Warren MP and Chris Gulaptis MP.

On the day, the children and young people received training in speech writing and advocacy. They were asked to prepare a one-minute speech on matters important to them under the themes of the NSW Strategic Plan for Children and Young People: Safe, Connect, Respect, Opportunity, Wellbeing and Voice. They rehearsed their speeches with YMCA and ACYP staff before making their way to present their speeches in the Legislative Assembly Chamber.

The Children's Week Youth Parliament Program is a reflection of this year's Children's Week Theme, Article 12 of the Convention of the Rights of the Child – the right of children and young people to participate in decision making and for their views to be heard and respected.

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
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AFS Intercultural Programs is looking for host families to volunteer to welcome our AFS exchange students from Japan (aged 16 years) from February to December 2019.
