Students are required to bring hats, sunscreen, plenty of energy food, swimmers etc. and lots of water! It will be a FANTASTIC day!


The excursion will cost \$60. This includes bus, guides and the Tree Tops Challenge. Notes and money need to be returned to the Student Services Office by 20th November.

Lismore High Campus

10:15am, upstairs in the staff common room.


Departure: School ends at 3:15pm. Students being picked up by parents should be collected from Alexander
