

At Kadina we pride ourselves on the variety of ways we engage young people in learning. The Greener Kadina gardening group is no exception. Once a week, five boys from Years seven and eight, work with Science teacher Mr Graf to get their hands dirty and make Kadina High a greener more beautiful place. The boys are learning about garden maintenance: how to plant trees, use tools, work safely and achieve something as part of a team. In the photo, small native trees and ground cover are being planted on a steep slope near the entrance of the school to prevent erosion, attract birds and pollinating insects. The boys love being outdoors and working with their hands, as well as the sense of achievement they get from a job well done. As a group they decide what projects they will work on. They must plan out what tools and plants will be needed, as well as water and maintain their creations. This means that they are also learning about budgeting, planning, patience and commitment. Next term the group will continue to work to improve the entrance of the school, so keep your eyes out for any changes. 





It offers Australian university graduates the opportunity to live and work in Japan as Japanese government employees. Roles are available as Assistant Language Teachers (ALTs) in primary and secondary schools, or Coordinators for International Relations (CIRs), interpreting and translating in local government offices.

Both are full-time, paid positions with requisite conditions.
