This project is about providing specialised spaces for the staff and students who work in our Multi-Categorical Class Support Unit. The contractors anticipate this project to begin on Thursday 17th June and conclude in November (pending weather and other external impacts). During this time there will be some minor disruption to our school. This includes:

- Potential relocation of classes to avoid construction noise.




College Road Show - One College, Three Days, Six Locations



Dear Parents, Carers and Community,

Thank you to those who were able to attend the information session last week about the Richmond River High Campus site and rebuild. I was also disappointed to hear the news that it will be highly unlikely to be able to return to the original campus site, with Richmond River having such a proud history of providing quality education to generations of families in our region.

Based on assessments, it is School Infrastructure NSW's view that extensive damage to the site during the flood event as well as vulnerability of the site to future flooding, will make it impractical and very difficult to return. It is important to note, however, that no final decision has been made. This will be handed down once the Department of Education (DoE) has consulted with the Northern Rivers Reconstruction Corporation (NRRC).

A priority for the DoE will be discussing the future use of the original site with NRRC once they begin work in July 2022. The DoE has indicated it is committed to rebuilding a modern, purpose-built school with new classrooms and learning spaces tailored to the educational needs of our community now, and into the future.

Schools Infrastructure have assured us that last week's updates were the first of many ongoing conversations between the DoE, our campus, college and community. The DoE is committed to working with staff and families to best understand and support the educational needs of our young people. We look forward to Richmond River students returning to a normal timetable in Week 2 of Term 3 as they transition back to full attendance into the well-resourced Temporary Richmond River High Campus learning spaces.




Kadina Parent Portal and App



The Sentral for Parents Portal and App allows you to monitor your child's school journey simply and efficiently. You will find numerous smart features that help streamline your day. Receive messages and notifications from teachers, receive important alerts and annoucements and even download school forms that your normally would of had to request. The Sentral for Parent Portal and App helps you to stay connected and informed about your child's education safely and securly from your own home.

We sent home letters with instructions on how to register and link your child to your account using the personal code issued to each student. If you have misplaced your letter please contact the school and we will orgainse a new letter to go out. Once registered and logged in please remember to take the second step of linking your child to your account, if you fail to do this you will not see personalised information and attendance data for your child, also, teachers and parents will not be able to communicate directly through the messaging function.
