# Lismore High Campus



The Rivers Secondary College Lismore High Campus, is a vibrant, coeducational Year 7-12 school in East Lismore, with a growing student body and a dedicated support unit. Steeped in tradition, representing its motto "Spectemur Agendo" — Let us be judged by our actions — Lismore High is the oldest public secondary school in Lismore, proudly celebrating its centenary in 2020.

## **Lismore High Campus**

Lismore High Campus features recently renovated facilities, including a gym, dance studio, drama room, aquaponics facility, updated science labs, and industry-standard Trade Training facilities in hospitality, metals & engineering, and construction. High Achiever classes support high potential and gifted students with enriching experiences, and STEM and design-thinking enhance numeracy and problem-solving skills.

Lismore High is proud to offer Bundjalung language lessons, enriching our strong focus on Aboriginal Education through cultural and academic support programs. Annual leadership camps foster skills for societal contribution, and senior students are encouraged to take on leadership roles in areas of interest.

We provide future-focused learning that builds foundation skills in literacy and numeracy, encouraging creative and critical thinking. Targeted programs such as Rock and Water and the Resilience Project, along with a holistic approach to wellbeing, empower students to reach their potential academically, socially, and emotionally. Our collaborative teaching integrates real-world challenges, preparing students for positive futures. An example of this is our flagship Tiny

Home construction program.

The Nesbitt Award, a longstanding campus tradition, offers scholarships to support student excellence. Each year, academic students in Years 7-10 receive \$500-\$1,000, while Year 11 duxes (one male and one female) awarded are \$5,000-\$10,000 each (depending on the annual interest earned by the trust). Each year the Allan Rutherford Balzer Scholarship (approximately \$10,000) is also awarded to someone special.

Our purpose is to develop resilient learners, nurturing strong ethics to equip students for lifelong success and contribution back to their community.













# Richmond River High Campus



The Rivers Secondary College Richmond River High Campus, is a dynamic, coeducational Year 7-12 school. The campus is dedicated to "Excellent Opportunities, Quality Teaching, Innovative Programs, and Student Success."

Drawing students from Lismore and surrounding areas, Richmond River High offers a wide range of academic, sporting, cultural, and social opportunities. Equipped with advanced technology and supported by passionate educators and staff, the school provides a learning environment where every student can achieve their full potential.

#### **Richmond River High Campus**

Currently, Richmond River High Campus operates from a newly resourced Temporary School due to the 2022 floods, sharing some facilities with Lismore High Campus while retaining access to our Agriculture plot in North Lismore. Plans are underway for a new campus build on Dunoon Road.

Our vision, "Learning for Life," drives our commitment to high expectations, collaboration, inclusivity, and respect. We strive for excellence in teaching and learning through consistent routines and strong student engagement initiatives. The campus meets diverse learning needs, including a High Achievers program for students from Years 7-10, and offers enriching experiences like musical events, the Byron Writers Festival, Bell Shakespeare workshops, sports, and other co-curricular opportunities. Richmond River High also has a strong Creative and Performing Arts program that inspires students to explore and express their artistic talents.

We proudly serve a diverse community of rural and urban families, alternative lifestyles, and First Nations cultures, which represent a significant portion of our student body. We are committed to fostering a learning environment where every student feels valued and can achieve success both in school and beyond.

Richmond River High offers an extensive curriculum, including advanced academic courses such as Extension English and Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, and Agriculture, along with a range of VET and TAFE options. Our Agriculture plot, featuring a teaching space, cattle handling facilities, pasture, chickens and tractors, is a cornerstone of campus life and learning.

Our students can also apply for the Carr Scholarship, a \$15,000 award provided annually to five Year 12 graduates with the highest ATARs to support their first year of university expenses.

Richmond River High is proud to offer Bundjalung language lessons, enhancing our commitment to Aboriginal Education and cultural awareness.

#### The Rivers Secondary College Shared Curriculum





### Rivers Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education



Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander education at The Rivers Secondary College is supported by dedicated teams at each campus, with all staff playing a role in meeting the individual needs of students. This commitment is reflected through diverse initiatives, programs and practices, including the Broncos Girls Academy, established in 2017 to provide culturally-based mentoring for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander girls in Years 7-12. The combined strength of the three campuses fosters collaboration among staff, enabling the sharing of expertise and best practices. Increasingly, staff are trained in Stronger Smarter and the 8 Ways pedagogy, driving meaningful progress in closing the gap for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. The Rivers Secondary College is proudly "Walking Together and Working Together" with our local AECG.

A partnership with the Lismore Local Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (LLAECG), these awards honor the excellence of students from Year 7 to Year 12. Parents, families, and community members are invited to join in celebrating the success of our students at the annual Proud and Deadly Awards ceremony.

#### Widjabal Wiyabal Dreaming

Widjabal Wiyabal Dreaming is a leadership initiative for aspiring Aboriginal and Torres Islander students at The Rivers Secondary College. This program brings students together for cultural and civic leadership workshops, empowering them to share ideas and voice concerns about issues affecting their communities. Conducted offsite, the program immerses students in learning about Culture, History, Identity, Awareness, and Language while fostering core leadership values. Many participants go on to excel academically, culturally, and within the wider community.





## **Rivers Creative and Performing Arts**



The Creative and Performing Arts is strongly supported across the college with access to a variety of subjects that focus on skill development, creative collaboration and opportunities, performance nourishing students talents and interests. Students have the opportunity to attend regular excursions to various locations, including an annual excursion for Year 11 students to Sydney. Over the years, students have attended workshops at The National Art School, NIDA and the Sydney Opera House. These excursions open up the creative world to our students and allow them to experience some of the best arts facilities in Australia.

#### THE RIVERS ACADEMY OF STEM EXCELLENCE

The Rivers Academy of STEM Excellence at The Rivers Secondary College fosters an integrated approach to Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM), equipping students with essential skills like creative and critical thinking, collaboration, and problem-solving. Through project-based learning, STEM electives, and the Design Thinking Process, students gain real-world skills that prepare them for an evolving workforce. Partnering with the NSW Department of Education and local industry, the Academy supports a K-12 STEM education pathway and hosts annual challenges, such as the bottle rocket and solar car events, bringing students together for hands-on learning experiences.

# Primary Partner Schools
