TRSC Examination Procedures

For Students

Where students are participating in a Shared Curriculum class at another school, this exam **takes place in your home school, except for practical subjects which may be held at the host campus.**

- Students are not expected to be at school at times other than when they have an exam
- Sign your name on the roll marking slips at the beginning of the exam. These will be on your exam table
- Students are expected to be familiar with all [NESA requirements](#) for each examination and to have all necessary equipment. **NO BORROWING OF EQUIPMENT IS ALLOWED**
- **Make sure any equipment you bring is in good working order as an appeal under misadventure provisions for equipment failure will not be upheld**
- Reading time is included for all examinations
- When the examination time has finished students must cease work immediately
- Cheating of any type will result in the student's paper being cancelled
- You should write in pen, preferably black, and bring an adequate supply of pens to each exam. You may wish to bring highlighters, pencils, ruler, and a pencil sharpener
- You may bring water in a clear bottle.
- All equipment you bring may be subject to inspection
- If you need to go to the toilet during the examination, place your hand up and wait for teacher advice
- **No one will be allowed to the toilet in the last TEN minutes of an examination**
- Some exams finish before others, please ensure you leave the exam as quietly as possible
- **Except in an emergency, no student will be allowed to leave the examination room during the scheduled time of the exam**

Examination conditions apply as soon as students enter and until students are out of the examination venue. Examination conditions mean the following:

- No talking
- No noise
- No communication
- No turning around
- No distraction to other students
- No looking at other students works. No moving from seat unless instructed to do so by the supervising teacher

You must not bring any of the following into the examination room: (Current NESA Equipment List Guidelines 2023)

- A mobile phone. Mobile phones are not permitted in an exam room under any circumstances
- A programmable watch, e.g a smart watch
- Any electronic device (except a calculator where permitted). This includes mobile phones or other communication devices, organisers, tablets (e.g iPads), wireless earphones/headphones (eg AirPods), music players or electronic dictionaries
- Paper or any printed or written material. You can ask your presiding officer for working paper
- Print dictionaries, except where permitted in language exams
- Correction fluid
- Students are not allowed to borrow equipment during exams

Failure to comply with these rules will result in a penalty and may result in the cancellation of student's examination paper.
